

Commonwealth Coordinated Care (CCC) Plus Waiver Fact Sheet - 2026

What is CCC Plus Waiver?

The Commonwealth Coordinated Care (CCC) Plus Waiver [1915 (c)] provides care in the home and community rather than in a nursing facility (NF) or other specialized medical facility.

Eligible Population

Individuals who meet the NF level of care criteria (i.e., they are functionally dependent and have medical nursing needs); **or** individuals who are dependent upon technological support and require substantial, ongoing skilled nursing care; **and**

- The health, safety, and welfare of the individual must be safely maintained in the home when the nurse or personal care aide is not present; **and**
- Are determined to be at imminent risk of NF placement; **and**
- Are determined that community-based care services under the waiver are the critical services that enable the individual to remain at home rather than being placed in a NF; **and**
- Are eligible for Medicaid.

Covered Services

- Personal Emergency Response System (PERS), including Medication Monitoring
- Respite Services (Agency and Consumer-Directed)
- Transition Services (Fee-for-service; members enrolled in managed care receive transition support as part of their plan)
- Adult Day Health Care
- Assistive Technology (AT)
- Private Duty Nursing (RN or LPN)
- Environmental Modifications (EM)
- Personal Care Services (Agency and Consumer-Directed)
- Services Facilitation

Waiver Enrollment

Local and hospital screening teams conduct screenings and assess the individual prior to the provision of services. The individual must also be enrolled in Medicaid prior to enrollment receive waiver services. Visit dmas.virginia.gov/for-applicants/ to learn more about applying for Medicaid.

Service Limitations

- Personal Care – Soft cap of 56 hours per week, exceptions available based on criteria
- Respite – 480 hours per State fiscal year (July 1 to June 30)
- EM – Up to \$5,000 per individual per calendar year
- AT – Up to \$5,000 per individual per calendar year
- Private Duty Nursing – cannot exceed more than 112 hours per week
- Transition Services – Up to \$5,000 per individual per lifetime
